Llama Production Classes

There is no additional fee to enter the production classes. All offspring entered in Produce of Dam and Get of Sire must be entered in their respective halter classes. Dams and sires do not need to be present at the show.

67. Produce of Dam - Entry is made in the dam's name. Any two offspring out of the same dam.
68. Get of Sire - Entry is made in the sire's name. Any three offspring by the same sire and out of at least two different dams.
69. Best in Futurity - The winner from each futurity class is invited back for the judge's selection of Best in Futurity
70. Bred and Owned Champion Female - The top placing bred and owned females from each division will be invited back to compete for Champion Bred and Owned Female. Your llama's registration papers will be used as proof of eligibility.
71. Bred and Owned Champion Male - The top placing bred and owned males from each division will be invited back to compete for Champion Bred and Owned Male. Your llama's registration papers will be used as proof of eligibility.
72. Best In Show - Champions from each division return to the ring to compete for Best in Show. 'Sibling Rivalry' Challenge - if there are at least 300 llamas entered, \$1,000 will be award to Best in Show.

Highlights

\$1,000 'Sibling Rivalry' Challenge - Best in Show

We're offering Best in Show with an added twist. We challenge the llama community to match or exceed the alpaca entry numbers. If there are 300 or more llamas entered in 2012 (including youth and mini llamas) then we will award \$1,000 to Best in Show. (Best in Show will be selected regardless of numbers.)

Virginia Classic Llama Futurity

Open to all juvenile and yearling llamas. \$50 per entry. No herd sire nomination required. A "**Best in Futurity**" will be selected from the four class winners. Go to www.llamalife.com/classic to download a separate Futurity entry form.

Performance Classes

Llamas may be shown by no more than two handlers. If two youth handlers are showing the same llama they **MUST** be in different age divisions. Llamas shown by two youths may not be entered in Novice or Advance.

Argentines Open to all llamas that are at least 50% Argentine or Rebrano Escondido bloodlines. (No premiums are awarded in this division.)

Classic Ccara Llama Challenge: As an added incentive to get those light-woolled/classic llamas into the show ring, the Virginia Classic will be offering a "**Classic Ccara Award**" to the lightest-woolled llama entered. The llama must come by his or her 'nakedness' naturally. There must be at least eight light wool females and eight light wool males entered and shown (not bumped up) in order for the prize to be awarded.

Bred and Owned Llama Champions will be selected from the top placing bred and owned llamas in each halter division. Trophies will be awarded to the champion male and champion female.

Llama Divisional Top Fives. Premiums will be awarded to the champion and reserve champions and rosettes will be awarded to the Top Five in each llama **division**. The top **five** placers from **each** class will be invited back for selection of the Divisional Top Five. Third through fifth placers should be at the gate for the championship classes. Once Grand and Reserve champions have been selected the third through fifth placers will fill in the lineup as needed. The judge may ask all top five places to stand in the ring at once. In theory, the top five in a division could all come from the same class. Youth and Performance Top Fives will be selected based on points. Obstacle class results will be used as the tie breaker.

Miniature Llama Division Llamas 38" at the withers and under.

Juvenile are not to exceed 35" at the shoulder. Yearlings must not exceed 36" at the shoulder. Two-year-olds must not exceed 37" at the shoulder. Entries must be registered with the ILR, but not necessary to be registered with AMLA. Llamas may be subject to measurement to verify eligibility.

Saturday Night Dinner and Awards Presentation. Please plan to join us for dinner Saturday night. In addition to a tasty dinner, we'll be presenting special awards. Dinner tickets are only \$20 each. You may sponsor a table for \$100 and decorate it any way you like. The table sponsorship includes two dinner tickets. An award will be presented to the best table.

Auction Donations will be accepted for the Saturday Night Auction. Funds raised will go towards the feed and care of rescued llamas.

General Entry Fees

- Entry fee per llama is \$45
- Stalls and tacks stalls \$60 each
- Futurity \$50 per entry
- Late entry charge is \$50 per farm.
- Substitutions and class additions are \$25 per change.

1. This show is approved by the ILR show-division **All** llamas entered **must** be registered with the ILR or CLRC with the exception of non-breeders and youth llamas.
2. **Copies of the registration papers must accompany show entry forms.**
3. Entries must be postmarked or e-mailed on or before Feb. 15, 2012.
4. Entries postmarked after Feb. 15 will be charged a \$50 late entry fee.
5. All llamas entered must be born on or before Oct 11, 2011.
6. All crias under 5 months must be accompanied by their dam.
7. The Virginia Classic accepts no responsibility regarding sales of animals. No llama under five months may be offered for

sale on the show grounds.

- Llamas **not** entered in the show are **not** permitted on the show grounds with the exception of nursing cria accompanying their dam. Exceptions may be made with prior consent by show management.

Health Regulations

- All llamas must show no evidence of infectious or contagious disease.
- All llamas must be accompanied by a health certificate (CVI) issued within 30 days of the show.
- Out-of-state llamas: Changes in the registration are scheduled to go into effect late January. This means all llamas coming from blue tongue and tuberculosis FREE states will only be required to have a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI). Please consult your vet as to the status of your state or have them contact the Virginia State Vet directly with questions.
- Microchips are an acceptable form of permanent identification.
- All owners must comply with Virginia State Regulations.
- Health papers will be asked for upon arrival.

ILR Show Division

You are not required to be a member of the ILR or the show division to participate in this show. There are no non-member fees. If you would like to have your placements applied towards the ILR award system, contact the ILR for membership information.

Premiums

Printed premiums and awards are subject to change. Show management reserves the right to withhold the payment of premiums to any exhibitor with an outstanding balance. Premiums will be issued within two weeks of the show. **If there are fewer than eight entries in a division premiums will NOT be awarded or division may be combined. If there are fewer than 100 llamas entered, no premiums will be awarded.**

Show Vet and EMT

Both a veterinarian and an EMT will be on call throughout the show for the safety of you and your animals. Vet charges must be negotiated between the vet and exhibitor.

T-shirts and Sweatshirts

The Virginia Classic T-shirts and sweatshirts will be "sand" this year. T-shirts (100% cotton) are \$15; sweatshirts (50/50 blend) are \$25; Sweatshirts must be ordered by Feb. 15 - no extras will be ordered. A limited number of extra T-shirts will be available at the show. Hooded sweatshirts are \$30.

Refunds

Show Cancellation: In the unlikely event the show is cancelled due to weather, The Virginia Classic exhibitors' entry fees will be reimbursed up to 75%. A blizzard forecast, or other severe winter weather forecast, would be the only reason for cancellation. Should it be necessary to cancel the show due to hazardous weather conditions, every attempt will be made to notify exhibitors no later than March 8th. **Refunds will be made only if the show is cancelled.** The show **will not** issue refunds due to individual weather or personal problems.

Show Program Advertising

The Virginia Classic will publish a high quality show program. This is a great opportunity for you to help support the show and promote your farm and/or products to a direct demographic. Each exhibitor will receive a copy and the rest will be handed out to the viewing public. Programs are keepsakes that are frequently reviewed.

Weather

March is unpredictable. It is not likely you will need fans to keep your llamas comfortable. The nights are usually chilly if not cold. Expect highs during the day to be anywhere from 40° - 60°. Be sure to pack something warm and dry to wear.

Medical Waste

ALL medical waste (needles, syringes, etc.) must be discarded in the appropriate containers located in each barn. **DO NOT** discard medical waste in stalls, manure pits, garbage cans or on the grounds.

Bio-Security

The Virginia Horse Center is one of the most bio-secure facilities you will occupy throughout your show calendar, as the stalling restricts animal contact with neighboring stalls. Please use common sense and courtesy when walking your animals around common areas.

Stalling

Stalling will be assigned and arranged on a first-come, first-served basis according to postmark. The stalls are 10' x 12' stationary horse stalls. Three sides are solid and roughly 8' high. The front is an open metal grid with sliding doors. The floors are dirt and electricity is available to each stall.

Panels are permitted in front of outside facing stalls *only*. If you wish to use panel extensions please request outside stalls in an outside barn

Bedding is required. Mats, carpeting, shavings, kenaf pellets, cardboard and straw are acceptable. (Sod, sand, wood chips and newspaper are **not** permitted.) Straw and cardboard bedding will be available for purchase at current market value.

Fees: All stalls are \$60. Maximum capacity for any stall is three (3) animals. Farms housing more than three animals to a stall will be charged \$50 for each stall violating occupancy rules.

Farm Displays - You will be allowed 3 feet out from the stalls for display purposes. Farm displays are encouraged. Vendor farm display space inside the arena is also available for \$125. (Ideal for those who wish to participate without bringing animals.)

Tack Stalls - Tack stalls are the same as standard show stalls and cost \$60. If you choose to share a tack stall with other exhibitors, please indicate who you'll be sharing with on your entry form so you will be stalled together.

Manure - All manure and used bedding from stalls or trailers must be placed in the designated areas. DO NOT discard manure in garbage cans.

Pets

All pets must be kept on a maximum 6' leash at all times and are the owner's responsibility. This is a county ordinance. Failure to comply will result in notifying Animal Control. **No pets** are allowed in the coliseum or in any office at any time.

Camper Hookup

Reservations will not be accepted. You'll pay for camper hook-up upon arrival. Water and electric. The horse center has 90 hook-up sites, so availability should not be a problem. Contact the Horse Center directly with questions concerning a camper hook-ups. .

Wash Stalls

There are a number of wash stalls available for bathing with cold water only. Beware, the weather may not be suitable for bathing.

Grooming

Exhibitors are responsible for collecting and discarding any and all loose fiber groomed off their animals.

Arrivals/Departures

You may arrive any time on Friday after 12:00 pm and before 10:00 pm. There shall be no arrivals between the hours of midnight and 7:00 am. If you need to arrive early or depart late contact Paige at 434-286-4494 to make arrangements. Additional fees may apply.

Security

There will be security guards on duty throughout the show. Please be sure to lock your vehicles and secure your valuables. The Virginia Classic is not responsible for loss of any kind.

Smoking

Smoking is **not permitted** in any building, rest room or stable.

The Virginia Classic Conduct Code

Show management reserves the right to disqualify and/or remove any exhibitor who behaves in a manner deemed improper, unethical,

cal, dishonest, unsportsmanlike or intemperate. Including but not limited to mistreatment of animals, or any comment or remark made in connection with the show considered offensive and/or made with the intent to influence or cast aspersions on the character or integrity of the judging, show management, show volunteers, sponsors or other exhibitors.

Definitions

Non-breeder: A castrated male or neutered female, vasectomized male, or reproductively unsound female. With the exception of castrated males, proof of non-breeder status must be provided.

Classic (Ccara) Division: Minimal double-coated body fiber, short neck wool with smooth leg. **Will be** combined with Light to Medium if there are fewer than 8 entries.

Light to Medium Fiber: Minimal to moderate neck wool, moderate to abundant body wool, smooth to moderate leg wool.

Medium to Heavy Fiber: Moderate to Abundant neck and body wool, minimal to abundant leg wool to at least the knee and/or hock. Borderline-heavy and heavily fibered llamas

Suri Llama: Llama narrow in appearance, with a natural part that exposes the spine, lock structure to the skin.

Miniature Llama: Llamas 38" at the withers and under. Juvenile are not to exceed 35" at the shoulder. Yearlings must not exceed 36" at the shoulder. Two-year-olds must not exceed 37" at the shoulder. Entries must be registered with the ILR, but not necessary to be registered with AMLA. Llamas may be subject to measurement to verify eligibility.

Performance Classes

Llamas may be entered only one division of each class.

Advanced or Novice. Llamas entered in youth may also enter novice or advance division if they have NOT been shown by two youths. .

Advanced Classes are open to llamas that are capable of competing at the advanced level. Llamas that have placed 1st, 2nd or 3rd three or more times in a novice or open levels of a given class **MUST** enter the Advanced level.

Novice Classes are open to llamas that have placed 1st, 2nd, or 3rd less than three times in the respective Novice or Open level of the given class.

Pack Classes are open to all llamas 18 months and older. Llamas are not required to carry weight but packs must be filled out. Novice and Advanced pack will be combined if there are fewer than 3 entries in either class.

Model Packer is a halter class judged on soundness, disposition and overall suitability for packing. Open to llamas entered in a pack class.

Bred and Owned means the owner of the llama was the owner of the dam at time of conception. The present owner is listed as the "breeder" on the registration certificate.
